NUISANCE BEAVERS

Road Maintenance

The Municipality of East Ferris Public Works Department provides a variety of road maintenance services during the winter and summer months. The municipal maintained road network consists of 29 km of paved roads, 41 km of surface treated roads and 35 km of gravel roads.

In general, our Public Works department provides the following services: Road Patrolling, Summer Maintenance including: Road Grading, Culvert and Drainage Maintenance, Pothole Repairs, Bridge Inspection & Maintenance, Sign Installation, Grass Cutting and Traffic Control. Winter Maintenance includes: Snow Plowing, Sanding, Salting and Culvert Thawing.

We are dedicated to public service, staff training and research into leading edge technologies for the maintenance of our assets to continually improve our level of service which, ultimately, will benefit the travelling public by providing safer roads.

Individual Rural Mailboxes

The placing of individual rural mailboxes on Municipal roads is governed by Canada Post. Once approved, mailboxes shall be installed to meet the Municipal standards. Mailboxes shall be inspected to ensure that they are correctly located and strong enough to withstand normal snow plowing operations. Over time, wood posts may deteriorate to the point where they are not capable of withstanding the weight of snow thrown up by snow plowing operations. The Municipality accepts no responsibility for improperly erected or deteriorated mailboxes. For more information regarding your mailbox, please refer to the Municipal website.

Management of Nuisance Beavers By-law 2022-42

Where dams occur on municipal property, the municipality has clear authority to remove or alter the dams to ensure the negative impacts of flooding on a public road(s) is minimized or controlled.

Where dams occur on private lands, the Municipality will encourage landowners to manage these nuisance animals and structures in an effort to help protect public assets from the negative impacts of flooding, which may occur when dams are suddenly breached as well as oversee any potential damage caused and ensure health and safety of the general public.

The Municipality will require corrective action as necessary to prevent damage to public infrastructure, in accordance with this By-law.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE DEPOT

The Municipality of East Ferris has an agreement with the City of North Bay for residents to use the Household Hazardous Waste Depot located at 112 Patton Street in North Bay (off Station Road/Seymour Street). It is open year round from Wednesday to Saturday from 8:00 am to 6:00 pm.

There is no charge for this service.

The Depot offers a **Free Paint Reuse Program**. Good quality paint, stains, varnishes and cleaners can be picked up free of charge.

Please bring your electronics to the landfill site, so that they can be recycled through the *Ontario Electronic Stewardship Program*.


- Used tires accepted at the landfill free of charge unless still on rims.
- Metal appliances are also free of charge unless they contain freon. If not freen free certified there will be a removal fee for cost recovery.

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TAXES AND ASSESSMENT

Did you Know... Property values are assessed by MPAC?

- Interim tax bills will be mailed out in January 2023.
- Installments are due on February 28th and March 31st, 2023.
- Final tax bills will be mailed in May 2023.
- Installments are due on June 30th and July 31st, 2023.

PAYMENT METHODS

PRE-AUTHORIZED TAX PAYMENT PLAN

The Municipality of East Ferris offers four convenient pre-authorized payment plan options:

- **#1. Monthly on the 1st or 15th of each month:** annual taxes are withdrawn over 12 months, from January to December.
- **#2. Bi-Monthly on the 1st and 15th of each month:** annual taxes are withdrawn twice per month over 12 months, from January to December.
- #3. Installment due dates: annual taxes are withdrawn on the due dates as per the tax bill.
 - Note: plan options #1, #2 and #3 are available to those ratepayers with no outstanding tax arrears.
- **#4. Arrears:** 12 monthly withdrawals on the 1st or 15th of each month subject to penalty and interest on any balance outstanding.
- BY MAIL (cheque or money order)
- AT THE MUNICIPAL OFFICE (cheque, cash or Interac)
- INTERNET/TELEPHONE BANKING

Payments can be made using personal online internet/telephone banking. Six (6) digits of your nineteen (19) digit roll number are required to process your payment. (i.e. 4834-0000-0<u>1-23456</u>-0000). Service charges may apply.

OTHER TAX INFORMATION:

NAME/MAILING ADDRESS CHANGES TO ACCOUNTS

The Municipality of East Ferris does not have the legal authority to amend the assessment roll without authorization from the **Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC)**. Legal documentation for changes/additions/deletions of names is required. Mailing address change forms are available at the Municipal Office or on our website. We will forward all changes to **MPAC** on your behalf.

ASSESSMENT APPEALS

If you disagree with MPAC'S assessment or classification of your property, you can file a Request for Reconsideration and they will review your assessment, free of charge. Your deadline to file a Request for Reconsideration with MPAC is printed on your Property Assessment Notice. For further information on the changes related to assessment appeals, please visit www.mpac.ca. In the event that you have filed an assessment appeal or a Request for Reconsideration, the Municipality of East Ferris must await notification by the Assessment Review Board or the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation before your appeal can be processed.

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BURNING

Our local Fire Department consists of Volunteers.

- Permits are required from April 1st to October 31st
- All fires larger than 1m x 1m (bonfires, brush burning and grass burning) require a permit.
- Fires 1m x 1m and contained in a pit by cement or steel rim so that fire cannot spread, do not require a permit.
- Day burning is NOT permitted Burning is only permitted after 6:00 pm and must be extinguished by 8:00 am unless otherwise approved by the Fire Chief or their Designate.
- Day burning may be approved by the Fire Chief or their Designate after a site inspection has been completed at a cost of \$75.00 per day.
- Discharging of fireworks must follow the open air burning regulation.
- Do not start fires or discharge fireworks when winds are above 15km/hr.
- Only burning of piled wood, brush, leaves or discarded wood byproducts is permitted. The material is to be burned in a single pile that must be 7.5 metres from any structures, buildings, or other flammable material.
- No person shall start a fire outdoors unless conditions will allow the fire to burn safely from start to extinguishment.

- A person who starts a fire outdoors or, if the person who started
 the fire is not present, a responsible person in charge of a fire
 outdoors shall take all necessary steps to tend the fire, keep the
 fire under control, and extinguish the fire before leaving the
 site.
- The person tending the fire must have tools and/or water adequate to contain the fire within the fire site.
- You are responsible for the control and extinguishment of your fire. Fires must be attended and completely extinguished prior to leaving the site.
- Failure to comply may result in fines in accordance with Schedules "B" and/or "C" of By-Law No. 2020-18.
- You will be invoiced the cost for the Fire Department to extinguish an unattended or out of control fire.
- Property owners are to provide tenants with the rules and regulations of all open air burning, as per By-law 2020-18.

BEACH AREAS

The Municipality has two official beach/swimming locations. Please note that dogs are not allowed in beach areas and must be on a leash in municipal parks. Beach areas are monitored by the North Bay, Parry Sound District Health Unit for water quality for swimming.

Big Moose Beach - 60 Big Moose Road, Corbeil

A great location to cool off during the warm summer months. The park is located beside the Government Dock and boat launch. The park has a picnic shelter with picnic tables, grassed areas, and sandy beach. A portable washroom is onsite

Centennial Beach – 555 Centennial Crescent, Corbeil This beach is available for public use and includes a small park area and picnic table.

MUNICIPAL BOAT LAUNCHES

The Municipality of East Ferris now requires licenses for Short Term Rentals operating in the community.

Short Term Rentals are defined as rentals for a period of less than 28 days and would commonly be associated with listings found on AirBnb, VRBO, etc. If you're planning on operating a Short Term Rental, make sure you have the necessary permits — For more information, visit: https://eastferris.ca/en/business-resources/short-term-rentals



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CURBSIDE COLLECTION

Did you know... garbage bags must be in containers?

Don't be late – Waste must be placed at the end of the driveway by 7:00 a.m. on collection day.

Keep the Weight Down – Items that are too heavy will not be collected. See By-law 2013-15 and 2020-42 (on municipal website) for weight limits.

Bag Limit – There is a weekly 3 bag limit for households for curbside collection and all bags <u>must</u> be in a container.

Avoid Accidents – Wrap broken glass and sharp objects in a puncture resistant package before putting them in your garbage.

Only put household waste at the curb – The municipality only collects household waste at the curbside. Household waste is consumer waste consisting of, but not limited to, non-recyclable items like food scraps and packaging originating from private homes.

Items **NOT** picked up at curbside

- Household hazardous waste
 (These items <u>are</u> accepted at the North Bay Hazardous Waste Depot.)
- Yard or construction/renovation waste
- Large items, appliances, electronics, tires
 (These items <u>are</u> accepted at the Landfill Site.)

FIRE PREVENTION MONTH!



KEEP FIRE SAFETY IN MIND AS TEMPERATURES DROP!

The Municipality of East Ferris Volunteer Fire Department is urging everyone to keep fire safety in mind as the temperatures turn colder.

There are some simple things people can do to stay fire safe during the colder months:

- Have all fuel-burning appliances inspected annually by a registered fuel contractor. Go to COSafety.ca to find a contractor near you.
- Keep chimneys and intake/exhaust vents for furnaces and heating appliances free of debris, ice and snow accumulations to reduce the risk of carbon monoxide (CO) build-up from inefficient combustion.
- Burn dry, well-seasoned wood in fireplaces and woodstoves to reduce the risk of excessive creosote build-up in chimneys.
- Allow ashes from your fireplace or woodstove to cool before emptying them into a metal container with a tight-fitting lid. Keep the container outside.
- Keep space heaters at least one metre (3 feet) away from anything that can burn, including curtains, upholstery and clothing.
- Replace worn or damaged electrical wires and connections on vehicles and extension cords and use the proper gauge extension cord for vehicle block heaters.

- Consider using approved timers for vehicle block heaters rather than leaving heaters on all night.
- Ensure that vehicles are not left running inside any garage or building.
- Ensure there is a working smoke alarm on every storey and outside all sleeping areas of your home.
- Install CO alarms to alert you to the presence of this deadly gas.
- In rental units, the landlord shall be deemed to be the owner.
- The Landlord shall provide a copy of the smoke alarm manufacturer's maintenance instructions or approved alternative to the occupant in each rental dwelling unit.
- No person shall intentionally disable a smoke alarm so as to make it inoperable.

The Municipality of East Ferris Volunteer Fire Department reminds everyone that the Ontario Fire Code requires smoke alarms to be installed on every storey of your home and outside all sleeping areas. Carbon monoxide alarms are required outside all sleeping areas if the home has a fuel-burning appliance, a fireplace or an attached garage. The Nosbonsing Curling Club is a 2 sheet curling club, running out of the East Ferris Community Centre. From late October through March, we offer:



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PLANNING & BUILDING

Are you thinking of renovating or constructing a new garage or home next year?


Come in to talk to the Planning and Building Departments now to begin discussing your plans to get a head start on the busy construction season. Your plans may require additional processes, so plan ahead.

The Planning Department reviews the following proposals:

- Site Specific and General Amendments to the Official Plan
- Site Specific and General Amendments to the Zoning By-law
- Applications for a Plan of Subdivision and Subdivision Agreement(s)
- Shore Road Allowance inquiries/purchases
- Applications for Minor Variance
- Applications for Consent to Sever
- Applications for Site Plan Control
- Other Land Use Matters

The building review will consider:

- · Requirements of a building permit
- Standards of the Ontario Building Code
- Compliance with NBMCA Septic regulations



- A structure with an area of 107 square feet or greater, consisting of a wall, roof and/or floor, and/or includes plumbing, fixtures, and services systems appurtenant thereto
- A detached shed 161 square feet or over
- A deck
- Projects where plumbing fixtures are added or relocated
- Demolishing a building
- Replacing shingles
- A pool
- A fence
- Installation of roof-mounted solar panels
- Constructing a new home/cottage or garage
- Major renovation projects

A Building Permit is NOT REQUIRED for the following:

- · Landscaping, sidewalks, driveways
- Painting and decorating
- New flooring (tile, carpet etc...)
- Installation of kitchen cabinets (not including plumbing fixtures)
- Replacing doors (in existing openings)
- Installation of new windows (in existing openings)
- Re-pointing brick veneer or chimney brick
- Replacing deteriorated wood for verandah floors or steps
- Installation of air conditioners or heat pumps
- Garden or tool sheds under 160 ft²/15 m²



SERVICES & WATER QUALITY

To ensure your well and septic are functioning and maintained properly, please remember to get your well water tested at least once

a year and also have your septic system inspected regularly. Also, to keep your system running efficiently, have your septic system pumped out on a regular basis. Contact the Municipal Office, North Bay Parry Sound District Health Unit or North Bay-Mattawa Conservation Authority for further information on wells and septic systems. You can pick up water bottles at the Municipal Office to test your well water.

Water samples can be dropped off at the North Bay-Parry Sound District Health Unit Monday to Thursday free of charge.

Your emergency survival kit should be unique to your household.


The basic items you should have in your kit include:
