general. Public Works our Department provides the following services: Summer Maintenance Road Patrolling, Road including: Grading, Culvert and Drainage Pothole Maintenance. Repairs, Bridge Inspection & Maintenance. Sign Installation. Shoulder Grass Cutting and Traffic Control. Winter Maintenance includes: Road Patrolling, Snow Plowing, Sanding, Salting. Brushing Culvert and Thawing.

We are dedicated to public service, staff training and research into leading edge technologies for the maintenance of our assets to continually improve our level of service which, ultimately, will benefit the travelling public by providing safer roads.

Individual Rural Mailboxes

The placing of individual rural mailboxes on municipal roads is governed by Canada Post. Once approved, mailboxes should be installed to meet municipal standards. Mailboxes shall be inspected to ensure that they are correctly located and strong enough to withstand normal snow plowing operations. Over time, wood posts may deteriorate to the point that they are not capable of withstanding the weight of snow thrown by snow plowing operations. The Municipality accepts no responsibility for improperly erected or deteriorated mailboxes.


Good Neighbour By-Laws



Good neighbours enhance the overall quality of life in East Ferris by promoting a culture of mutual respect, cooperation, and shared responsibility for the well-being of the entire community. A brief outline of good neighbour by-laws are listed on this page to help foster a sense of community. To view the by-laws in full, please visit our municipal website at eastferris.ca

Short-Term Rentals: The Municipality of East Ferris recently passed a by-law to regulate the use of rural and residential properties for Short Term Rentals. By-law 2022-36 provides rules and regulations around the operation of a Short Term Rental. A License from the Municipality is required to operate all Short Term Rentals.

Fireworks: By-law 2023-36 describes the regulations surrounding the setting off of fireworks within Municipal boundaries, including certain days of the week and holidays. The release of flying lanterns is prohibited in East Ferris.



Noise: By-law 2015-33 regulates excessive noise. It states that no noise be so excessive that it would cause hardship to a neighbour. This can include loud music and dogs barking. The Noise By-law is in effect from 11:00 p.m. through 6:00 a.m.

Nuisance Beavers and Dam Management: If a river is backed up in several locations and one dam gives way, it can cause downstream flooding, damage to natural habitats and damage to other properties and roadways. Property owners are responsible for monitoring waterways and resolving any dam issues located on private property.

Payment Methods

PRE-AUTHORIZED TAX PAYMENT PLAN

The Municipality of East Ferris offers four convenient pre-authorized payment plan options:

- #1. Monthly on the 1st or 15th of each month: annual taxes are withdrawn over 12 months, from January to December.
- #2. Bi-Monthly on the 1st and 15th of each month: annual taxes are withdrawn twice per month over 12 months, from January to December.
- #3. Installment due dates: annual taxes are withdrawn on the due dates as per the tax bill.
- #4. Arrears: 12 monthly withdrawals on the 1st or 15th of each month subject to penalty and interest on any balance outstanding.

Note: plan options #1, #2 and #3 are available to those ratepayers with no outstanding tax arrears.

- INTERNET/TELEPHONE BANKING

Payments can be made using personal online internet/telephone banking. Six (6) digits of your nineteen (19) digit roll number are required to process your payment. i.e. 4834-0000-01-23466-0000).

Name/Mailing Address Changes to Accounts

The Municipality of East Ferris does not have the legal authority to amend the assessment roll without authorization from the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC). Legal documentation for changes/additions/deletions of names is required. Mailing address change forms are available at the Municipal Office or on our website.

Assessment Appeals

If you disagree with MPAC'S assessment or classification of your property, you can file a Request for Reconsideration, free of charge. Your deadline to file a Request for Reconsideration with MPAC is printed on your Property Assessment Notice. For further information on the changes related to assessment appeals, please visit www.mpac.ca. In the event that you have filed an assessment appeal or a Request for Reconsideration, the Municipality of East Ferris must await notification by the Assessment Review Board or the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation before your appeal can be processed.

Burning

PERMITS ARE REQUIRED FROM APRIL 1ST TO OCTOBER 31ST

- All fires larger than 1m x 1m (bonfires, brush burning and grass burning) require a permit. Fires 1m x 1m and contained in a pit by cement or steel rim so that fire cannot spread, do not require a permit.
- Day burning is NOT permitted Burning is only permitted after 6:00 pm and must be extinguished by 8:00 am. Day burning may be approved by the Fire Chief or their Designate after a site inspection has been completed at a cost of \$75.00 per day.
- Only burning of piled wood, brush, leaves or discarded wood by products is permitted. The material is to be burned in a single pile that must be 7.5 meters from any structures, buildings, or other flammable material.
- No person shall start a fire outdoors unless conditions will allow the fire to burn safely from start to extinguishment.
- A person who starts a fire outdoors or, if the person who started the fire is not present, a responsible person in charge of a fire outdoors shall take all necessary steps to tend the fire, keep the fire under control, and extinguish the fire before leaving the site.
- You are responsible for the control and extinguishment of your fire. Fires must be attended and completely extinguished prior to leaving the site.
- Failure to comply may result in fines in accordance with Schedules 1B and/or 11C of By-Law No.2020-18. You will be invoiced the cost for the Fire Department to extinguish an unattended or out of control fire.
- Property owners are to provide tenants with the rules and regulations of all open-air burning, as per By-law 2020-18.

Beach Areas

The Municipality has two official beach/swimming locations. Please note that dogs are not allowed in beach areas and must be on a leash in municipal parks. Beach areas are monitored by the North Bay, Parry Sound District Health Unit for water quality for swimming.

The park is located beside the Government Dock and boat launch. The park has a picnic shelter with picnic tables, grassed areas, and sandy beach. A portable washroom is onsite

Centennial Beach - 543 Centennial Crescent, Corbeil

This beach is available for public use and includes a small park area and picnic table.

Garbage & Recycling

Don't be Late: Waste must be placed at the end of the driveway by 7:00 a.m. on collection day.

Keep the Weight Down: Items that are too heavy will not be collected. By-law 2013-15 describes weight limits.

Bag Limit: There is a weekly 3 bag limit for household curbside collection. All bags MUST be in a container with a lid.

Avoid Accidents: Wrap broken glass and sharp objects in a puncture resistant package.

Household Waste Only: Only household waste will be collected. Household waste includes, but is not limited to. non-recyclable items like food scraps and packaging.



Fire Safety

East Ferris Fire & Emergency Services is urging everyone to keep fire safety in mind as the temperatures turn colder. There are some simple things people can do to stay fire safe during the colder months:

- Have all fuel-burning appliances inspected annually by a registered fuel contractor. Visit COSafety.ca to find a contractor near you.
- Keep chimneys and intake/exhaust vents for furnaces and heating appliances free of debris, ice and snow accumulations to reduce the risk of carbon monoxide (CO) build-up from inefficient combustion.
- Burn dry, well-seasoned wood in fireplaces and woodstoves to reduce the risk of excessive creosote build-up in chimneys.
- Allow ashes from your fireplace or woodstove to cool before emptying them into a metal container with a tight-fitting lid. Keep the container outside.
- Keep space heaters at least one metre (3 feet) away from anything that can burn, including curtains, upholstery and clothing.
- Replace worn or damaged electrical wires and connections on vehicles and extension cords and use the proper gauge extension cord for vehicle block heaters
- Consider using approved timers for vehicle block heaters rather than leaving heaters on all night.
- Ensure that vehicles are not left running inside any garage or building.
- Ensure there is a working smoke alarm on every storey and outside all sleeping areas in your home.
- Install CO alarms to alert you to the presence of this deadly gas.
- A landlord shall provide a copy of the smoke alarm manufacturer's maintenance instructions or approved alternative to the occupant in each dwelling unit.
- No person shall intentionally disable a smoke alarm so as to make it inoperable.

Planning & Building

Are you thinking of renovating or constructing a new garage or home next year?

Come in to talk to the Planning and Building Departments now to begin discussing your plans to get a head start on the busy construction season. Your plans may require additional processes, so plan ahead.

The Planning Department reviews the following proposals:

- Site Specific and General Amendments to the Official Plan
- Site Specific and General Amendments to the Zoning By-law
- Applications for a Plan of Subdivision and Subdivision Agreement(s)
- · Shore Road Allowance inquiries/purchases
- Applications for Minor Variance
- Applications for Consent to Sever
- Applications for Site Plan Control
- Other Land Use Matters

The building review will consider:

- Requirements of the building permit
- Standards of the Ontario Building Code
- Compliance with NBMCA regulations



A Building Permit IS REQUIRED for the following:

- A structure with an area of 107 square feet or greater, consisting of a wall, roof and/or floor, and/or includes plumbing, fixtures, and services systems appurtenant thereto
- · A detached shed 161 square feet or over
- A deck
- Projects where plumbing fixtures are added or relocated
- Demolishing a building
- · Replacing shingles
- A pool
- A fence
- Installation of roof-mounted solar panels
- Constructing a new home/cottage or garage
- Major renovation projects

A Building Permit is NOT REQUIRED for the following:

- Landscaping, sidewalks, driveways
- · Painting and decorating
- New flooring (tile,carpet etc...)
- Installation of kitchen cabinets (not including plumbing fixtures)
- Replacing doors (in existing openings)
- Installation of new windows (in existing openings)
- Re-painting brick veneer or chimney brick
- Replacing deteriorated wood for verandah floors or steps
- Installation of air conditioners or heat pumps
- Garden or tool sheds under 160 ft 2/15 m2

Household Hazardous Waste Depot

The Municipality of East Ferris has an agreement with the City of North Bay for residents to use the Household Hazardous Waste Depot located at 112 Patton Street in North Bay. It is open year round from Wednesday to Saturday, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. There is no charge for this service. For more information, please call 705-474-0400 ext.2333.

To ensure your well and septic are functioning and maintained properly, please remember to get your well water tested at least once a year and also have your septic system inspected regularly. Also, to keep your system running efficiently, have your septic system pumped out on a regular basis. Contact the Municipal Office, North Bay Parry Sound District Health Unit or North Bay-Mattawa Conservation Authority for further information on wells and septic systems. You can pick up water bottles at the Municipal Office to test your well water.
